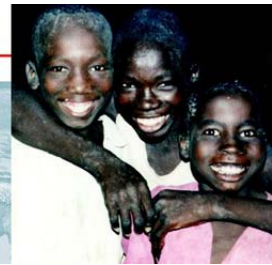

The current global crisis has revealed serious shortcomings of the global economic governance architecture: regulatory deficits, a lack of inclusiveness, ineffective institutions etc. Although the crisis has complex causes, there is strong evidence that regulatory deficits in the financial markets played a mayor role in its development. One silver lining that appears during the present crisis is that it provides a political opportunity to carry out desirable regulatory reforms. Debate on new ideas for financial regulation as well as on changes in the institutional arrangements is urgent. The Dialogue on Globalization Luncheon provides an opportunity for that much needed debate.

The Dialogue on Globalization Luncheon series brings together groups of 20 odd policy makers and experts to discuss global challenges and prospects for global governance with distinguished guests speakers.
