The Hambach Festival of 1832 was an important milestone in the German and European democracy movement and also shaped the development of social democracy. Hambach Castle today is a symbol not only of the history of German democracy, but also of European unification and Europe's ideals and history.

The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung invites politicians, experts in democracy and representatives of European civil society, as well as young people and young professionals from all over Europe, to reflect on democracy in Europe in this historical location.
